# What has been happening at PLPS?

**LEADERSHIP DAYS** —On Monday and Wednesday the Student Leadership Team ran a leadership morning for the Year 5 and 6 students. These mornings were part of a program that has been designed and run with these groups of students over the course of Term 4. The aim of the program and the day is to develop student leadership skills and capacity in preparation for 2021. The day consisted of 6 rotational based activities where the students looked at what it takes to be a leader and positive role model. We had guest speakers across the two days – Matthew Morgan, Pete Williams Graham Johncock and Mayor Brad Flaherty for each running a session to inspire the students. We look forward to hearing the Year 5 and 6s present their candidacy speech in Week 7.



**SAMMY D FOUNDATION**— How lucky we were to be the 300th school that the Sammy D Foundation has presented to. Neil Davis who spoke to our Year 6 & 7's is the father of Sam Davis whose young life was tragically cut short when Sam fell victim to a one punch attack.

The Sammy D Foundation educates young people on the impacts of bullying, violence and alcohol fuelled violence, by providing relevant age appropriate information, knowledge and tools. The Foundation empowers young people to make positive life decisions for a better community. **On Sunday the 4th of May 2008, the life of 17 year old Sam Davis was tragically cut short. Sam fell victim to a one punch attack.**

As a fiercely loyal young man with an ability to form friendships, Sam made a huge impact on many. From an early age and throughout his life, Sam showed integrity and strong values, defending those being bullied and treating others with respect.

Sam had many notable achievements, but none more so than his talent and passion for sport. Playing state soccer, indoor and outdoor cricket, and indoor netball from an early age, Sam excelled at any sport he put his mind to. The decision Sam's parents had to make when faced with organ donation was simple, as they knew that this was his intention. Sam was blessed with a healthy, well-functioning body, and they wanted to ensure that him being taken was not for nothing.

Following the devastating loss of Sam, his parents, Nat Cook and Neil Davis, founded the Sammy D Foundation, with the ultimate aim of providing skills to young people in order to prevent such a tragedy from happening again. We thank him for taking time to visit us and helping to educate our students on how making the wrong decision can have long lasting and far reaching effects on families and community.

## MATHS AT HOME IDEA!



### Browsing Catalogues

Discussing catalogues can be a great way to improve your child's maths knowledge of money and percentages.

- \* Select five products from the catalogue, then calculate what the cost would be if there was a 50% sale. Does it make a difference if you add up the items, and then deduct 50% or if each item is reduced by 50% then totalled?
- \* What is the best value sale item in the catalogue? Can you explain your reasoning?
- \* Compare the cost of a product across different stores using different catalogues. What did you find?



**Nunga Kids Cafe**

**Tuna Casserole**

**Ingredients:**

- 500g pasta (any type)
- 2 tablespoons margarine
- 1 carrot, grated
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup plain flour
- 1 1/4 cups low fat milk
- 1 small packet of frozen peas (250g)
- 250g corn, tinned or frozen
- 425g canned tuna in spring water or brine, drained and flaked
- 1 cup low fat cheese, grated
- Breadcrumbs

**What to do:**

1. Wash your hands
2. Boil water for the pasta. Add pasta to saucepan. Boil until soft. Drain. Put pasta into ovenproof dish
3. In the same pot, make the white sauce by melting the margarine
4. Add the carrot and onion and cook for a couple of minutes
5. Add flour and mix to a smooth paste
6. Gradually add milk over the heat and stir until sauce thickens
7. Add peas, corn and tuna to the sauce and pour mixture over pasta
8. Top with cheese and breadcrumbs and cook in the oven at 250°C until golden brown


